

2021 New York State Snowmobile Safety Course

LOCATION: Warren County Sheriff's Office, Training room, 1400 SR 9, Lake George, NY 12845. Enter Municipal Center complex, bear left, WCSO on left partially around circle. Use Main Entrance – upper level by the American flag.

DATE: Saturday, December 18th, 2021 8:00AM - 4:00PM.

OVERVIEW: This course is FREE and is open to anyone who is 10 or older on the date of the course.

COVID 19: There is 30 person limit in the Training Room. This includes students, parents/guardians & instructors. If registration numbers dictate, parents & guardians will not be permitted to sit in as in past years. If the person you are registering is unable to sit through the course and or take an exam without parental supervision, it would be best to postpone their attendance.

-Appropriate COVID 19 face masks are encouraged for all and mandatory for non-vaccinated individuals.

Completion: To successfully complete the course each student must attend the entire class and receive a score of 75% or better on the final exam. Yes, there is an exam, but don't worry, thus far, we have enjoyed a 100% success rate! This will be a fun/informative course! A temporary certificate will be issued upon successful completion of the course.

Lunch: The South Warren Snowmobile Club has offered to sponsor lunch in the form of pizza/soda. You may also bring snacks/drinks and a bag lunch if you prefer.

If your plans change, and your child is no longer able to attend this class, please advise by e-mail ASAP to open the spot to another individual.

All students under the age of 18 will need to have the attached permission slip printed/completed/signed, prior to the start of class.



New York State Snowmobile Safety Education Program Course Permission Statement for students ages 10 through 17

(This may also be used as a registration form for adults taking the course)

This course is designed to fulfill safety certificate requirements. It is offered to those ages 10 through 17 and to adults that wish to receive a safety certificate.

New York State law requires youths ages 14 through 17 years of age to earn a safety certificate in order to gain the privilege of operating a snowmobile as an adult. Youth ages 10 through 13 may operate a snowmobile, on lands upon which snowmobiling is allowed, if they have completed a snowmobile safety training course recognized by the State of New York and are accompanied by (within 500 feet of) a person who is at least 18 years of age.

Successful completion of this course requires the student to:

1. **be at least 10 years old (on or before the day the course ends)**
2. attend class sessions
3. complete the workbook accurately
4. receive a score of 75% or better on the final examination

Only those students meeting all of the above criteria will receive a New York State Snowmobiling Safety Certificate.

The course is taught by volunteer instructors who are experienced snowmobilers and have been certified as snowmobile safety trainers.
